A. The Department of Plant Science and Landscape Architecture proposes the following:

1. ADD: LAND 3140 Graphics IV: Advanced Computer Applications. Effective Spring 2017 (# 606) (Mark and Sal)

Proposed Catalog Copy:

LAND 3140 Graphics IV: Advanced Computer Applications. Three credits. Two class periods and two 1-hour lab. Prerequisites: LAND 3130; open to Landscape Architecture majors only or with instructor consent. Westa.

Knowledge, theory and application of advanced computer applications used in site planning and site design.

2. ADD: LAND 3580 Field Studies in the Built Environment. Effective Spring 2017 (#609) (Mark and Sal)

Proposed Catalog Copy:

LAND 3580 Field Studies in the Built Environment. One credit. Three day-long field trips. Prerequisites or Co-requisite: LAND 2410; open to Landscape Architecture majors only or with instructor consent. May be repeated for up to 6 credits. Westa.

Travel to examples of landscape architecture, urban design, art installations or other related examples of spaces or places.

Discussion: The motion to add LAND 2510 was amended (Mark and Gary) to change the number to 3580 since the course numbers xx80 or xx90 are reserved for field studies, which this is. It was also suggested to be a 3xxx level because of the pre- or co-requisites and prior knowledge of the field required would make it more appropriate at this level. It does not preclude sophomores who meet the pre- or co-requisite from enrolling. This change was approved by the course proposer.

1. ADD: NUSC 1693 International Studies. Effective Spring 2017 (#638) (Rhonda and Gary)

Proposed Catalog Copy:

NUSC 1693 International Studies in Nutritional Sciences. Either semester. Variable credits (1-15). Hours by arrangement. May be repeated for credit. Open only with consent of department. Open to sophomores or higher. Variable topics.

Coursework undertaken within approved education abroad programs.

2. ADD: NUSC 3273. Cooking Techniques for Specialized Diets. Effective Fall 2017 (#723) (Rhonda and Sal)

Proposed Catalog Copy:

NUSC 3273 Cooking Techniques for Specialized Diets. Two credits. Three hour laboratory and one hour discussion. Prerequisite: NUSC 3233, 3234 and 3272; open only to Nutritional Sciences students.

Preparation and discussion of heart healthy, calorie controlled, gluten free, and vegetarian foods; food allergies, sugar substitutes, recipe modification and application of food sanitation. A fee of \$50 will be charged for this course.

3. REVISE: NUSC 3180. Experience in Community Nutrition. Add NUSC 3230 to the list of prerequisites. Effective Spring 2017 (#741) (Rhonda and Gary)

Current Catalog Copy:

NUSC 3180. Experience in Community Nutrition One to six credits. Prerequisite: NUSC 1165; consent of instructor required. May be repeated for credit. No more than six credits of experience or independent study may apply toward the major. Supervised field work with community nutrition education or problem-solving. Readings and reports.

Proposed Catalog Copy:

NUSC 3180. Experience in Community Nutrition One to six credits. Prerequisite: NUSC 1165 and 3230; consent of instructor required. May be repeated for credit. No more than six credits of experience or independent study may apply toward the major; open to juniors or higher. Supervised field work with community nutrition education or problem-solving. Readings and reports.
